

Health in the City: Enhancing Trust at Times of Crises



How to engage with religious leaders and faith communities in your city when responding to immediate and longer-term threats? This session will provide lessons learned from COVID-19, which inform new collaborations in Urban Health and resilience.

Background and Rationale

A healthy city is one that continually creates and improves its physical and social environments and expands the community resources that enable people to mutually support each other in performing all the functions of life and developing to their maximum potential. COVID-19 is a good case study for illuminating the important role of municipalities in dealing with Global Public Health emergencies and the gaps in their preparedness for the next one.

Faith Leaders and local Faith-based organizations in Europe have been an asset in minimizing the effect of the pandemic and in enhancing preventative measures.

We shall learn in this Session best practices from several countries in Europe and discuss:

- Why in the COVID-19 response, engagement with faith leaders was important?
- How to engage with religious leaders and faith communities in different contexts when responding to immediate and longer-term threats?
- How to navigate and overcome challenges that come from engaging with faith leaders in pursuit of SDGs' attainment?
