Scaling-up the 2030 Agenda means of implementation for sustainable structural transformation in South-Eastern Europe region

27 March 2023, 15:00-16:30, Palais des Nations, H building, Room 307-2 (Hybrid)

Background and Rationale

Governments across the South-Eastern Europe region are focused on ensuring a simultaneous treatment of emerging needs in light of the current energy crisis and the pressing global challenges, particularly climate change. Innovation, a more circular economy and connectivity/trade facilitation are central to achieving these objectives. The three themes also feature prominently in the European Union's priority strategies and plans, including, among others, accelerating the implementation of the "European Green Deal" and "Fit for 55 Package" as well as the "New Circular Economy Action Plan" and the "New Industrial Strategy".

- Demonstrate how UNECE work streams and tools on SDG 9, 12 and 17 can support the implementation of the South-Eastern Europe region's national and sub-regional development plans in these areas.
- Discuss how UNECE could step up support to the South-Eastern Europe region's development plans and their alignment to the 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda.

The outcome of the panel discussion will inform ECTD future work in support of the South-Eastern Europe region.
