Building Effective Partnerships for Digital Transformation

*Thursday 14 March 2024, 10:00 – 13:00 CET

Background / Scenario

In the pursuit of the Sustainable Development Goals, the persistent digital divide remains a significant challenge, hindering progress and impacting 2.6 billion lives globally.

In order to meet the central promise of the 2030 Agenda to leave no one behind, uniting the efforts of various stakeholders is critical to put progress on the SDG's back on track. These partnerships are significant not only for SDG17, but also for the Global Digital Compact, proposed under the Common Agenda and informed by the Roadmap for Digital Cooperation. The Global Digital Compact is expected to be agreed upon at the Summit of the Future in September 2024.

In the letter released earlier this year, the co-facilitators of the UN Global Digital Compact made it clear: We need to collectively harness the benefits and manage the risks of digitalization for all.

Simultaneously, the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS) called for the organization of regional WSIS follow-up activities. This time, they have particular relevance, as the WSIS marks a significant milestone of twenty years of progress. As part of this ongoing review process, a WSIS+20 High Level Event will be held in May 2024 in Geneva, Switzerland.

The focus of the session aligns with the forthcoming Summit of the Future, emphasizing international digital partnerships and reviewing the impact of the WSIS at the regional level. Delving into crucial policy areas, such as infrastructure development, digital skills, data governance, and more, the session aims to foster a safe and inclusive digital environment.

A spotlight on developing countries from the region will provide insights into ongoing digital transitions, achievements, and work on the ground, addressing regional nuances. It will look at factors hindering internet connectivity access and use across communities and locations. It will discuss the importance of robust digital infrastructure as a prerequisite for the successful uptake of ICT solutions. The session will underscore the core role of partnerships across sectors in digital transformation, discussing future trends, challenges, and opportunities to enhance goal delivery.

Guiding Questions:

1. What are the key policy actions or implementation experiences that have significantly contributed to bridging digital divides?
2. What potential collaborative initiatives or partnerships currently exist or are envisioned for the future that can further accelerate the digital transformation in the region?
3. What are the key policy action solutions to developing resilient ICT infrastructure?
4. Delving into crucial policy areas such as infrastructure development, digital skills, and data governance, what are some best practices and innovative strategies that can foster a safe and inclusive digital environment, especially in developing countries and economies in transition?
5. Exploring innovative elements, what unique approaches or strategies have been employed in your respective contexts to foster digital inclusion and ensure the responsible use of digital technologies?
