

# Teachers as agents of change in inclusive digital learning and recovery for all children CONCEPT NOTE

## **Background and rationale**

The 2022 Regional Forum on Sustainable Development for the UNECE Region is a unique opportunity to take stock of progress and challenges in achieving SDG 4 commitments in the light of unprecedented educational crises that call for system-level strategies to promote solutions for improving the inclusiveness of education systems. The large-scale roll-out of digital technology in learning during education crises provides an opportunity to build more robust, inclusive, and equitable systems for all children. The countries in the UNECE region have already begun to leverage digital technologies to make schools more resilient and accelerate learning recovery. The integration of digital technology can enhance the transformation of the education system, which will need to be accompanied by continuous professional development (CPD) for teachers. Teachers need sustained support for improving their pedagogical and digital skills to encourage innovations in education and develop competencies required for inclusive teaching and learning. The event will feature innovations and partnerships harnessed by UNICEF and UNESCO to strengthen teachers' digital-pedagogical competencies to drive equitable, inclusive learning for all learners, building resilience to adapt to the evolving contexts. It will reflect progress and challenges in achieving SDG 4 during the pandemic, which reconstructs the concept of teaching and learning and redefines teachers' role in enhancing inclusiveness and learning recovery in the digital era. It will discuss why strengthening educators' digital-pedagogical capacity must be central in responding to the learning crisis and transforming education systems. Speakers from the Education Ministry and UNICEF/UNESCO offices will present using interactive formats.

## Session objectives and expected outcomes

The event will highlight innovative strategies, partnerships and programmes developed by the UNICEF Regional Office for Europe and Central Asia (ECARO), UNESCO Regional Office for Science and Culture in Europe and select Field/Country Offices in supporting capacity strengthening on teachers' digital-pedagogical competencies to stimulate a discussion on the importance of equitable, inclusive digital learning for all children and learners. It will demonstrate how relevant and central the strengthened educators' digital-pedagogical capacities would become in response to the current crises and their recovery processes at the country level. The event will also explore the evolving concept of teaching and learning and the potentially growing role of teachers in improving inclusiveness and learning in the digital era to empower and motivate all children and learners. Hands-on knowledge and

experiences at the country level will showcase how reshaping national teacher CPD systems helps advance inclusive education reforms and build more resilient and transformative education.
